

**Term 1 Final Assessment  
Cross-Curricular Project  
Grades 6-10**

UAE Social Studies, English, English Social Studies, ICT, Art, and Business Studies

Overview:

Grade 6-10 students will be completing a Cross-Curricular Project as their term 1 final assessment for UAE Social Studies, English, English Social Studies, ICT, Art, and Business Studies. The project is 35% of the student's term 1 grade for each subject.

Key Points:

- Students will be given time during class to work on their projects but they are expected to work at home as well;
- Teachers will be guiding students throughout the process;
- Students will receive a rubric that will outline the success criteria.

Topic:

The project should reflect UAE heritage, culture, and heroism. Topics to choose from are:

  - cover page (cover slide)
  - table of contents
  - subject heading on each page and page numbers;
- Students should complete outlines/planning docs for each component;
- The project should be submitted electronically (email) to each respective teacher;
- The project should be ordered according to the table below, from left to right per grade;

### Reflection Summary:

- Upon completing the assignment, the final task of the project is to complete a personal reflection for each subject.
- The student is expected to write no more than 100 words on each subject.
- Reflective writing should be personal, written in the first person.
- Examples of reflective learning:
  - What did I learn? I learned...
  - What did I enjoy? I enjoyed...
  - What did I find difficult?
  - What would I do differently the next time?
  - How can I apply what I have learned?
